

Subject: Columbia River Region 2001 SCHOLARSHIPS ANNOUNCEMENT

CRR-ASPRS is pleased to announce the availability of two scholarships that will be available for the 2001-2002 academic year and will each consist of a cash award of \$1,000, a one-year student membership in ASPRS, and a complimentary conference registration (not including workshops) for GIS in Action 2001.

Applications are invited from students, attending colleges and universities within the Columbia River Region of ASPRS, who are preparing for a career in Photogrammetry, Remote Sensing, Cartography, or Geographic Information Systems. The applicant must be either a U.S. citizen, or a legal resident alien, pursuing a full-time program of study during the 2001-2002 academic year leading to either a Bachelor's, Master's, or Doctorate degree. Undergraduates must have attained at least Junior-class standing by the beginning of the 2001-2002 academic year.

The Scholarship Committee Chair must receive the application by April 30, 2001. Successful recipients will be notified of the selection prior to the GIS in Action 2001 Conference, which will be held May 31-June 1, 2001 in Portland, OR. The scholarship awards will be announced at the Conference, so each recipient is encouraged to attend and be recognized for his or her accomplishment.

Please find enclosed a list of official guidelines and an application form. We request that you make photocopies of both documents, as needed, to post and/or distribute to qualified students as soon as possible.

2001 SCHOLARSHIP GUIDELINES

PURPOSE:

The purpose of this award is to assist a student pursuing a full-time program of study in one of the subject areas of interest to the Columbia River Region of the American \Society for Photogrammetry and Remote Sensing.

AWARD:

- The Award shall consist of a cash award of \$1,000;
- A one-year student membership in ASPRS; and
- 3. A complimentary registration for GIS in Action 2001 (not including workshops).
- Announcement of the award recipients will be made at the GIS in Action 2001 Conference.

ELIGIBILITY:

- The student must be pursuing a full-time course of study leading to either a Bachelor's, Master's, or Doctorate degree at a college or university within the Columbia River Region of ASPRS during the period for which the award is made.
 - Undergraduates must have attained at least Junior-class standing by the beginning of the 2001-2002 academic year.
 - Community or junior college students are eligible, contingent upon acceptance into the Junior year of a 4-year program of a qualified college or university.
 - c. One award will be made at the undergraduate level and one award will be made at the graduate level, if sufficient high-quality applications are received for each level.
- 2. The student must be a U.S. citizen or a legal resident alien.
- The course of study must be preparing the student for a career in Photogrammetry, Remote Sensing, Cartography, or Geographic Information Systems.
- 4. Previous recipients of this award are eligible to apply again.

BASIS OF AWARD:

- The applicant will be evaluated on the basis of a complete application package consisting of the following:
- a. A completed application form;
 - Proof of enrollment in, or acceptance to, an eligible program of study at a college or university within the Columbia River Region of ASPRS;
 - c. Official transcripts of all college level coursework taken to date;
 - d. Three (3) letters of recommendation, at least two (2) of which must be from faculty members able to evaluate the student's academic potential in the chosen area of study (letters of recommendation should be mailed directly to the Scholarship Committee Chair); and
 - e. A brief (1-2 pages) statement of your careerrelated experience, career goals and how this scholarship would help further your pursuit of your future goals.

SELECTION:

- Evaluation of the applications, and selection of the recipient, shall be made by a committee of three persons appointed by the President of the Columbia River Region.
- The recipient will be notified of selection prior to the GIS in Action 2001 Conference in May 2001, so that the official announcement of the award may be made at the conference.

<u>DEADLINE</u>: The Scholarship Committee Chair must receive completed application packages by April 30, 2001.

NOTE TO ALL APPLICANTS:

Responsibility for insuring that a complete application package is submitted rests with the applicant. Incomplete applications may not receive full consideration by the selection committee.


