



The national Executive Committee met via teleconference on February 7 this year. Originally scheduled for Baltimore, the heavy snow storms that hit the Washington-Baltimore area prevented travel into the region, so we spent the day getting to know our telephones. Because of the deviation in our normal routine, the meeting was abbreviated with summaries of all agenda items and discussion over only highlighted issues.

The society continues to be financially very healthy. We are recognizing some returns to our investments since the bleak days of 2009 and we do seem to be on a good recovery track. If you recall, we actually came through the recent economic unpleasantness have lost less than the average investment accounts. In a backhanded way, I suppose that was good news.

Our membership has once again taken a turn for the worse. Overall in 2009 we suffered a 4% drop in active members. Student membership was up by 5%, which is good news. The goal we be the retention of those student members once they enter the actual workforce. In the Columbia River Region, 2009 produced a 9% drop in active members and a 7% increase in student members. The region and society continue to focus our membership efforts on retention of current members, recovering recently lapsed members, and enlisting new student members.

Another new initiative for 2009 was the ASPRS Workshop Webinar Series. Three successful webinar workshops were held in 2009, Preperation for ASPRS Certification, ASPRS LiDAR fundamentals and Applications Workshop, and ASPRS Orthophoto workshop. With a total of 85 registrants, a significant proportion of the attendees who filled in the evaluation summary inidicated that this was their first ASPRS workshop. Since these workshops are typically offered at the annual and spring meeting, and sporadically throughout the regions, we are now able to reach people who traditionally were unable to take advantage of these valuable workshops. There are two workshops already completed in 2010 (Preparation for Certification and Hyperspectral Remote Sensing) with several more under consideration, including: Fornesic Photogrammetry, Mobile Mapping, Emerging Technologies in Photogrammetry, Web 2.0 with GIS, and Assesing the Accuracy of GIS Information created from Remotely Sensed Data. More information about these sessions can be found on the ASPRS website.

ASPRS has also obtained a Twitter account (ASPRSorg) in order to add this social media to our marketing strategy. The tool will be used by ASPRS Divisions, Committees, and Councils to post important messages on their activities.

The spring meeting is coming shortly in San Diego (April 19-23), and I will have a new and more complete report for you all in the Second Quarter Newsletter. Until then, I wish you all a healthy and prosperous remainder of 2010.

Her project was to classify satellite images of Serbia in cooperation with the European Environmental Agency. They employed the CORINE (Coordination of information on the environment) methodology in their work. The presentation was an informative look into how land-use and land-cover analysis is conducted on a regional scale.

Travel award scholarships in the amount of \$250 were awarded to Lily House-Peters and Bethany Pratt to attend the AAG Conference (Association of American Geographers) in Washington and the ASPRS Annual Conference in San Diego respectively. We are looking forward to hearing exciting reports about these events when they return.

The GIS Certificate program at PSU has been experiencing some of its highest enrollments ever. The satellite image analysis class was split into two sections to handle the additional student load. In my capacity as a teaching assistant running lab sessions for section two, I took the opportunity to promote GIS in Action and its poster competition. So far, we are sending five students to GIS in Action using our PSU funding. We expect some interesting posters to emerge from these class projects.
